

2024 Fast Facts

- Goodwill of Colorado helped change the lives of 143,061 Coloradans through our local community programs.
- 5,262 volunteers invested 106,407 hours to help further our mission in local communities.
- We employed 3,300 Coloradans statewide.
- 65% of Goodwill of Colorado's social enterprise team members have a barrier to employment.
- 43,250 individuals received free job training and coaching to help them begin a new career.
- We kept 471 tons of computers, printers, cell phones and other electronics out of Colorado landfills through our Dell Reconnect program.
- 63 of 64 counties in Colorado served.
- 9,000 Coloradans impacted by economic challenges and disasters received clothing and merchandise vouchers.

- Our shoppers made 5,920,986 purchases in our stores and outlets. Your support makes our mission possible!
- Goodwill of Colorado diverted more than 190,000,000 pounds of donated items from local landfills.
